MINUTES OF THE PROCTOR CITY COUNCIL MEETING OCTOBER 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022

Mayor Ward called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Pledge of Allegiance

A. City of Proctor Finance Report – Q3

Administrator Rich states this report has been submitted by Finance Director Leslie Brunfelt and directs council members to address any questions to her. Councilor Benson extends appreciation for submittal of the report.

M/S/P: Benson/Ward to accept the quarterly finance report as submitted by Finance Director Brunfelt.

#### **B.** CDBG Pre Application

Administrator Richs states there have been two applications submitted on behalf of the City of Proctor. She gives a summary of the qualification requirements, stating overall the City of Proctor qualifies for projects related to public service. There has been an application submitted for a handicap accessible bathroom at the Playground for EveryBody and the creation of a lift assist connectivity program. The City of Proctor would work in collaboration with assisted living facilities in town, providing training and programming for lift assists. This program would work in partnership with the volume of lift assist calls the fire department has received with the anticipation of the increase in these types of calls.

#### C. Playground for EveryBody Report

Administrator Rich provides a summary of the project stating the equipment has been installed, with a delay in the shipment of the correct railings. Once railings are installed, the playground can officially open to the public. The project has logged over a total of 800 volunteer hours and the city is currently seeking a grant from the Read Foundation to assist with the remaining expenses.

#### **4. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

M/S/roll call vote: Johnson Y, Benson Y, Ward Y, Rohweder Y, DeWall Abstains: to accept the recommendation from the Proctor Public Utilities Commission and appoint Troy DeWall to the open seat.

M/S/P: Rohweder/Johnson to accept the recommendation to terminate Steve Grabko from the Proctor Fire Department as submitted by Chief Helquist.

Discussion: Mayor Ward states the proposed policy addresses lift assist calls at licensed care facilities, not addressing the numerous calls placed to private residences for lift assist and non-emergent care. Administrator Rich provides the council with information and an increasing trend in calls placed to licensed care facilities, noting the policy would be in place for proactive reasonings and is hopeful of the newly proposed program of safety trained personnel assistance to alleviate some of the call load for the fire department members.

M/S/P: Rohweder/Ward to approve resolution 37-22 as submitted.

M/S/F: Rohweder/Benson resolution 38-22 fails by a vote of 0-5 with resolution 38-22 not approved as submitted. Andy Padzak answers questions with clarification and the approval from the relief association. Councilor DeWall states a summary of the contributions, annual increases, and potential cautions with market uncertainty and fiscal responsibilities on behalf of the city. Motion by DeWall, seconded by Rohweder and carried 5-0 to increase the benefit level to \$100.00 effective 1/1/23 for a total of \$2400.00 a year to be reassessed at the June council meeting. M/S/P: Ward/DeWall to approve resolution 39-22 as submitted.

M/S/P: Ward/DeWall to approve participation and authorizing Administrator Rich to accept the TZD agreement with St. Louis County as submitted.

M/S/P: Ward/DeWall to approve the boiler quote in the amount of \$134,265.00 as submitted.

M/S/P: Benson/Rohweder to approve the change orders as submitted:

Change order #1 in the amount of \$13,995.15 addresses soil corrections on the newly constructed road required after the completed soil borings.

Change order #2 in the amount of \$2,145.00 and change order #3 in the amount of \$1700.00 are related to a problem with a fiber optic line owned by Lumen Technologies who have been negligent in the line relocation. The line services Carlton County 911 operations, and all correspondence directed to Lumen beginning in February of this year went unanswered until the project was already in progress. Additional grading, elevation, and a temporary access has needed to be constructed in order for the project to continue. Administrator Rich states she is working with the city attorney in addressing these delays and additional costs.

Administrator Rich states the total estimated costs for this project as calculated by SEH originally amounted to \$717,000.00. With the submitted change orders and received bids coming in lower

than anticipated, the project is expected to come in slightly under the originally calculated amount.

Dear Regional Safety Group member,

Greetings from the League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust Regional Safety Group Program Coordinator Ashley Edwardson. I am writing to let you know that the Board has approved a contract renewal with the Minnesota Municipal Utilities Association (MMUA) for Regional Safety Group (RSG) trainers. Under the terms of the contract, the cost of MMUA training meetings will increase from \$1,325 per meeting to \$1,650 per meeting. LMCIT will continue to pay 55% of the cost leaving each group to pay the remaining 45%, \$742.50. The RSGs have not had a member facing fee increase since 2017.

MMUA is currently the only statewide provider of safety training that meets the tailored needs of our individual cities. Based on the summary of our 2022 RSG Survey, we saw that RSG members are satisfied with their MMUA trainers and the meetings they conduct. These findings led the Board to approve the price increase, which will fund MMUA's increased costs for fuel, employee benefits, and training.

The program's cost increase went into effect Oct. 1, 2022. Members will be billed for 2022 in January 2023 and will see a slight increase applied to their invoice for the final three months of 2022. The new rate will then apply to the entire year of 2023, which will be invoiced in January 2024.

The Board believes these cost increases contribute to maintaining the RSG program's reputation of being a personalized, top-tier, and still affordable, training program. Please feel free to reach out to me if you have any questions about the decision to renew our contract with MMUA.

- VII. School District Plan Review Water is again bypassing the curb cut to the pond and running into Kirkus Street. Jess sent a letter to the school district but hasn't received a response yet. No updates this month.
  - A. Hockey Arena There are still improvements needed to make the site compliant. They generally include:
    - 1. Pond 3 Expansion Troy asked SEH for price to process HydroCAD updates and determine how much bigger the pond needs to get.
    - 2. Pervious Areas at Pond 2 Pond 2 needs more live space and less dead space. They can either adjust the outlet down or make pond 2 bigger. This will be reviewed after new calculations are performed.
    - 3. Maintenance Agreement not complete yet.

#### VIII. Miscellaneous

A. St. Louis County – 2<sup>nd</sup> Street Concrete Repair Project

- 1. Primarily concrete repairs (street, sidewalk, curbs)
- 2. Matt reached out to County to let them know City may want to replace a short piece of VCP sanitary sewer at the 2<sup>nd</sup> / 5<sup>th</sup> intersection. During discussion, it was decided the short piece of sanitary can be part of a future lining project. Matt will inform County of this change Matt will send out typical section to County for reference.

#### B. Pickleball Courts

- 1. Jess will discuss with group to determine how the project should proceed. Any update or assistance needed?
  - a. The city was thinking that they could possibly convert the outdoor hockey rinks to paved Pickle ball courts at the new hockey area. The only issue with this is that the ponds on the School property would likely need to be upsized for the added impervious amounts.
  - b. The other option that the City is looking at is the gravel lot up from the new Playground for Everybody on Pionk.
- C. Storm Water Utility No update this month.
- D. PUC Water Break Sites
  - Field work is complete. SEH to review restoration and see if any punchlist items are necessary. Rick and Jay have reviewed sites and didn't note any restoration items to be addressed.

  - 2024 PPL Jess would like to get the water and sewer lines from 2<sup>nd</sup> Street to Westgate on the PPL for future funding.

    - Section #1 is also high priority as it takes flow from entire city to the WLSSD meter station.
    - d. A new forcemain could be directionally drilled from Westgate to the north.
    - e. Rick provided known information on existing pipe ages and blockage history.

This responds to your October 12, 2018, request for information regarding the status of your group tax exemption.

Our records indicate that you were issued a determination letter in March 1946, that you are currently exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and are not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because you are described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(i).

With your request, you provided a copy of the Official Catholic Directory for 2018, which includes the names and addresses of the agencies and instrumentalities and the educational, charitable, and religious institutions operated by the Roman Catholic Church in the United States, its territories, and possessions that are subordinate organizations under your group tax exemption. Your request indicated that each subordinate organization is a non-profit organization, that no part of the net earnings thereof inures to the benefit of any individual, and that no substantial part of their activities is for promotion of legislation. You have further represented that none of your subordinate organizations is a private foundation under section 509(a), although all subordinates do not all share the same sub-classification under section 509(a). Based on your representations, the subordinate organizations in the Official Catholic Directory for 2018 are recognized as exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Code under GEN 0928.
